STOP!

The simple future

To form the simple future, add **will** before the **main verb**. In the negative form, add **not** between **will** and the **verb**. You can also use the contracted form **won't**.

Affirmative +	Negative -
will + main verb	will + not (won't) + main verb
→ I will run .	→ I will not run . / I won't run .
→ I will go camping.	→ I will not go camping. / I won't go camping.

To ask a question, inverse the **personal pronoun** and **will**.

You will visit your family. → **Will you** visit your family?
